


National Medicines and Pharmacy Services Strategy



Transforming Delivery

- Increasing on-site pharmacies in reception prisons- now have 46 (=+5) in the last 2-3 years
- Consideration of pharmacy and medicines access points in new prisons, expansions and temporary accommodation (Sept-Dec 2022!)
- HJ Prescribing data in ePACT2 and other population health/model health systems
- Electronic transfer of HJ prescriptions

Improve Health Outcomes



- Dependence Forming Medicines:
 - AHSN-led opioid collaborative programme
 - SMRs in HJ practice to align with PCNs
- Overprescribing review- polypharmacy
- Access to HIV PreP and PEP (30 day course)
- HJ medicines indicators- sharing and improving recording and delivery- Meds Rec and Meds/Rx supply
- Re-audit of RPS standards via regional quality schedule

Transform Continuity



- FP10 access and use- NHSBSA/NHS E&I briefing
- Sustaining 28-day supply on release- post EPS using FP10
- Sharing models of Buvidal introduction
- Revision of transfer/release and reception templates to support medicines supply on transition



Health and Justice Trainee Pharmacist Placements

- Given the success of General Practice cross sector placements and recent changes in initial education and training for pharmacists, there is a national expansion of Trainee Pharmacists placements within Health and Justice healthcare centres.
- Trainees will be hosted by a Community Pharmacy or Hospital Trust and will spend a <u>13 week period</u> within the Health and Justice setting.
- This is part of the national strategy to increase the number of crosssector training posts. It is hoped this will support create pharmacists for the future who will find it easier to move between sectors and have a more rounded training year.



Reforms to initial education and training of pharmacists



The foundation training year will further expose trainee pharmacists to new situations and environments. This will give them opportunities to build upon their knowledge and skills and demonstrate these with patients in clinical settings.






